He later was a charter member of Theta Gamma chapter at Eastern Illinois University.

Brother Cannon shopped around the idea of Kevin joining the fraternity through chapters from northeastern Ohio to southwestern Pennsylvania. Those initial efforts didn't work out. However, that wasn't a deterrent. After countless interactions with Brother George Charlton (Province Polermarch) to come up with a game plan, it was agreed that the best fit was to begin a pledge class at Edinboro University and work with Brother Michael McLendon and use brother Cannon's swing chapter experience to begin a charter at Edinboro.

Fast forward to 1987, through the efforts of both chartered and non-charted members, Nu Zeta Chapter was formally created to serve the northwestern area of Pennsylvania which include the colleges of Edinboro University, Gannon University, Behrend College, Alliance (now defunct), Allegheny College, Thiel and Mercyhurst University. Nu Zeta has its origin from brothers who represent Beta Epsilon, south, and midwest chapters. Although Brother Cannon sparked the effort, he was quick to point to others, especially the Erie Alumni Chapter (Brothers Cannon, Chance, Evans, Harper, Horton, Jefferson, Knupp, Law, Martin, Meredith, Taliefero, and Thompson) who ushered the dream to fruition.
